# Open Door Center is a non-profit corporation serving people with disabilities.



The past two years have been difficult as the Center has been inundated with Covid. It began in March 2020 upon the completion of our CQL survey for which we received a 4-year accreditation. However, Covid-19 and its many variants were not impressed with this accomplishment and continued to pursue all of us. Consequently, in November of 2021 the Center was forced to make a decision that was not accepted by all. Due to OSHA and CMS the Center was informed that vaccination was not a choice but a requirement. Open Door Center after much research, agonized discussion and decision making chose to follow the declarations by these two federal agencies that control much of the funding for the Center. This resulted in staff resigning, not completing shifts, or refusing to meet the requirements of the mandate. These problems coupled with the labor shortage has created empty shifts. Many of the staff who left were good staff and their abilities are missed. However, the Center has been fortunate to have many excellent staff remain. Most staff, including DSPs and management, have volunteered to work overtime, and their commitment is truly appreciated as is the continued assistance of the Board of Directors.

The State is moving forward with monetary enhancements for recruitment of new employees and retention of current staff for the next year. This should assist with some of today's problems, but the State must commit to the long term employment needs of those in community services to people with disabilities. It is essential to invest more on a continual basis to meet the needs of children and adults who have an intellectual disability, a behavior health problem, or a brain injury. The paltry sum of .25% proposed as a raise for those who work in the field of disabilities will not meet the persistent need for recruitment and retention. However, whatever the future brings as the Open Door Center moves forward, our wish for all is a healthy, safe, and blessed 2022.
