THE DILEMMA FACING THE FIELD OF DISABILITY SERVICES

The last three years have impacted all of us including our families, co-worker's employer and especially people with disabilities. Since the pandemic, the turnover rate of jobs in the health care area has significantly climbed and has impacted Open Door Center, basic care such as HI Soaring Eagle Ranch and many, many, other supportive facilities as well as main street businesses.

The staff of the Open Door Center work nontraditional hours, shifts that span 24 hours a day, seven days a week and with staff shortages, the hours of overtime keep climbing, often creating undetected personal problems. The staff is mandated to participate in work related training. Yes, it can be used to meet undergraduate credits, but it can time out after 24 months. Most of the training modules are competency based requiring a passing test score. Just one more requirement to say nothing of the background checks, drug testing and required CMS regulations regarding Covid vaccination, boosters, and masks. The disability field is one of the most regulated areas of service.

The mission of disability service facilities is to enhance, improve and advocate for positive change for all people but especially for those with disabilities that are often the forgotten. Many people served by Open Door Center and the more than thirty one similar organizations found in 195 North Dakota communities is to provide essential care and long-term support for over 7,000 people. However, there are still those who fall through the cracks or for some technicalities do not meet eligibility for services. These individuals are often isolated, have a higher rate of poor health and are more prone to abuse, neglect, exploitation, or mistreatment.



We want to support more individuals and have the facility areas to do so, but throughout North Dakota we are experiencing a critical labor shortage. Service facilities are not alone but some agencies have closed facilities displacing people who have lived there for decades. However, since the beginning of the pandemic, turnover has significantly increased with some areas experiencing an average turnover rate greater than 45%. There are over 700 vacancies throughout the state and the average rate for workers is comparable to frying burgers in a fast food facility. We can't just fry burgers but are required to provide supports that offer a more meaningful and productive life and critical support for some of North Dakota's most vulnerable children and adults.

This information is provided to create awareness and education to citizens, legislators, and stakeholders with the hopes that the billions of oils and Covid dollars will be used to better the employment situation in service facilities and throughout North Dakota.

Jacqueline "Jackie" Devillers 09-24-1954 ~ 11-21-2022 (Parts of Jackie's Beautifully Written Obituary following)

Jackie spent most of her life in Valley City, ND with her family. She attended the Open Door Day Activity Center starting in 1959. In 2009 Jackie moved with her parents to Wahpeton, ND and attended the Red River Human Services Day Activity Center.

Jackie never won any awards or received any accolades during her lifetime, these items were not important to her. Her family was her greatest reward and the most

precious thing in her life. Everyone she met was a friend for life. Articulating sur names was difficult so you were given a "nickname" and it was yours for life. She would invite you to "come play", bring your "jammies" and "stay". She loved everyone without hesitation, especially children. She loved her family and always wanted them to "come home"!

Jackie's favorite day of the week was Sunday. She never missed her beloved "church-church" and was up early each Sunday to pick out her favorite outfit and jewelry to wear. If God ever made the perfect church "greeter", it was our Jackie. No congregation was too large for her to shake every hand and give them a hug if Mom didn't see.

Christmas was Jackie's favorite time of the year. She helped decorate to the best of her abilities, ridicule her siblings' inability to wrap packages and sit for hours admiring the lights, the decorations and of course the packages beneath the tree. Perhaps it was the anticipation of her "family" once again, all in her home, together sharing happiness even for just one day. She made sure everyone had a package to open, that she opened her packages last and that each Christmas day would last forever.

Jackie gave and taught more to her siblings than she will ever know. If you did great, she showered you with accolades and make you feel like you conquered the world. However, if you screwed up, she admonished you with a "no-no", a quick report to our parents, only to return with a loving hug and always forgiveness. Whenever you were sad or sick, she was there with a hug, a kiss and a reminder that your family loves you no matter what and life will get better soon. Jackie was not handicapped in our eyes, she was our sister. We fought for her, and we protected her. We fought with her. Just like we did with and for each other. She picked on us and we picked on her. Hey, what are sisters for anyway? She gave us a perspective on life that few will ever understand. No matter how bad we have it on our worst day, it is never anything that could compare to what Jackie was handed in life. So, we thank God every day for giving us Jackie, our loving big sister, who was always on and at our side. Even in her final moments she fought for every breath to stay here, with the family she so loved. Now she is with us in spirit, watching over us and protecting us.














Janna's Dream Vacation
