# **LUCKY ME**

Hello everyone and thank you! Today, before my retirement, I want to take a moment to share with you all how much you've meant to me for the past four decades. When I was hired for this position, I wasn't sure what to expect and never thought it would be a predominate part of my life for forty-one years. I have worked for Open Door Center more than half my life. Lucky Me! You can't imagine the bonds formed over these years. I never could've imagined the wonderful people that have become a part of my life and how much I learned from all connected to Open Door Center.

We raised our two sons with the Open Door Center, and they helped entertain some of our guests who had no place to go on Christmas Eve. They, too, had the opportunity to learn from the residents who were a great addition to our Christmas - Lucky Them!

I began my career as the administrator of a fledgling agency that had made a commitment to serve people with disabilities due to a controversial lawsuit between the State of North Dakota and the Department of Justice. It wasn't always roses, but the people made everything better as they do every day.

The first weeks were involved in getting to know the seventeen staff and the twelve individuals served by Open Door Center. During the early months I wondered why I hadn't heeded the pressing conversation of the two plus hours of the initial interview with Perry Grotberg, Dr. Keith Devillers and Earl Pomeroy. However, Lucky Me that I was offered the position and agreed to work for the Center.

The first day was an eye-opener. One individual asked me to run away with him. The staff welcome wasn't as happy since they had preferred the other candidate. However, it wasn't too long before all involved with the Center began to work as a team.

It was obvious that the employees were striving to offer a variety of experiences for individuals and assist them in becoming part of the community. The enthusiasm of the individuals for their new experiences were the impetus for all of us to continue to strive for new and better methods to support individuals and begin to truly listen to them and their families. With a commitment of all, we are able to pass the surveys required by the State, just one of the many requirements.



#### SUMMER TIME FUN GRILLING RECIPE FROM THUNDERBIRD RANCH/DAKOTA SEASONINGS GOURMET COOKBOOK

#### Grilled Sriracha Blackened Turkey Breast


#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 Tbsp Thunderbird Ranch Sriracha Blackened Rub or to taste (use any TBird rub)
- 1 Tbsp Olive Oil
- **♦ Turkey Breast 6-9 lbs**
- ♦ 12 oz can of beer

#### **Directions:**

- Mix oil and rub together.
- Line a 9x13 inch baking pan with tinfoil. Place a rack inside the pan to raise turkey off the bottom of the pan.
- Place turkey in the pan, lift the skin away from the turkey breast and rub the mixture. Also rub the outside of the turkey skin with mixture.
- Pour beer in the bottom of the pay (NOT OVER THE TOP OF BREAST).
- Tent with tinfoil.
- Grill at 300 degrees until internal temp reaches 175 degrees (approximately 2-3 hours depending on size of breast).
