## Science of Gratitude

Despite the first October snowfall and feeling rather tired after a long week, I am feeling particularly grateful today. I'm grateful our snow removal crew knocked it out of the park this morning, for our amazing staff's part in three successful state surveys, for the 38-year anniversary of the Hi-Soaring Eagle Ranch, for my incredible (and crazy) family...I could go on and on. Like all of you, however, I have plenty (yes, PLENTY) of challenges, too. I have learned over the years to actively practice gratitude. There is actually research to support this...it's called the science of gratitude.

In 2015 two psychologists from the University of Miami and the University of California studied the physical outcomes of practicing gratitude. One third of the subjects in the study were asked to keep a daily journal of things that happened during the week for which they were grateful. Another third was asked to write down daily irritation or events that that bothered them. The last third of the group was asked to write down daily situations and events with no emphasis on either positive or negative feelings. At the end of the 10-week study, each group was asked to record how they felt physically and generally about life. The gratitude group (group 1) reported feeling more optimistic and positive about their lives than the other groups. Additionally, the gratitude group was more physically active and reported fewer doctor visits than those who wrote only about their negative experiences.

Additional research has been conducted since 2015. Findings indicate that gratitude positively impacts health, improves mental well-being, calms the nervous systems, and deepens resilience. So, does that mean one should sugar-coat challenges or view negative situations with 'rose-colored glasses?' Absolutely not! Focusing on what you are grateful for actually helps you become more resilient in the face of adversity and tackle challenges with a better mindset.

Whether the upcoming holiday season is welcomed and festive or overwhelming and anxiety-producing, I encourage you to take a few minutes to focus on the goodness in your life (both personal life and work life). Focus on what you have instead of what you don't have. Better yet, share that gratitude. Write a good ol' fashioned note, send an email, keep a gratitude journal, pray...whatever works for you. Sharing your gratitude just might make you happier!












October Fishing Days
